

SCHEDULE OF FEES

AGISTMENT

- \$210¹ / week to include
- Morning & evening hard feed²; hay at lunch³
 - Rugging (max 3 rugs)
 - Daily turnout; mucking out
- Additional costs
- A regular worming program that includes all horses. Worm paste is on-billed in monthly agistment invoice
 - Night accommodation may be in either stable or paddock depending on your choice & availability. If in stable, shavings used are on-billed at cost

A weekly retainer fee will apply should the horse be spelled off-site:

- \$50/wk for the first 2 weeks p/annum
- 50% of usual agistment fee thereafter

BOOKINGS & CANCELLATIONS

- Regular bookings
- Based on school terms, taking a 'regular' spot gives you a guaranteed day/time. We do require payment up front at the start of each term. If this is not possible for you, please discuss with us. Places / days / times are reviewed before the start of each term.
- Provided we receive at least 7 days notice, we will endeavour to organise a 'catch up' lesson if you have to miss one. Regrettably we cannot guarantee horse / instructor availability for this. There will be no refund on pre-paid lessons.
- 'Ad hoc' bookings
- Can be organised as/if required providing there is horse/instructor availability. Once a booking is made we charge 50% of usual fee if the lesson is cancelled with more than 24 hours but less than 7 days notice. If cancelled with less than 24 hours (or 'no show') full lesson fee is charged.
- Wet weather
- Lessons CONTINUE in bad/wet weather. In extreme conditions stable management is taught.
